



## Scholarships and Bursaries 2019

---

### INTRODUCTION

This note supersedes the Scholarship and Bursaries 2018 intake document and will apply to 2019 awards.

### SCHOLARSHIPS

#### UK/EU/EEA AND SWISS STUDENTS (DOMESTIC)

Merit based scholarships are available to domestic students studying an undergraduate degree at the New College of the Humanities (the College).

Qualifying applicants to the College will be automatically assessed for a scholarship and this will be communicated in any offer they receive. Assessment is based on a number of factors, including actual and predicted grades as well as performance at interview.

Scholarship awards can range from £500 to £2,000 and are awarded on an annual basis. Awards in subsequent years of study are dependent on satisfactory attendance and academic performances (generally an average mark equating to a 2:1).

Students can receive both a scholarship and bursary award, but no combined award can exceed £2,000 in any year.

#### INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

For the 2019 intake, international undergraduate students will be considered for scholarships on the same basis as domestic students. The only exception to this relates to combined awards – international students not being eligible for bursaries.

#### BURSARIES UK/EU/EEA/SWISS STUDENTS

The College's bursaries scheme applies to domestic undergraduate students only.

Under the scheme that will apply for 2019 entry, bursaries of up to £2,000 per annum for each year of study will be available for students whose household income does not exceed £42,000.

As is currently the case, students and prospective students will be made aware of the bursary scheme, the eligibility criteria and how to apply during the application process, at the interview and via communications to offer holders.

Due to the fact that the bursary criteria are based on household income, applicants will be made aware that relevant financial information must be shared with the College in order to progress an application.

Bursaries are awarded on a yearly basis. Subsequent yearly awards are dependent on satisfactory attendance, academic performance and confirmation (or otherwise) of financial circumstances.

Students may elect how they receive their bursary – either as a reduction in their fees - or as a cash amount.

Students can receive both a bursary and scholarship award, but no combined award can exceed £2,000 in any year.
