<p>To undertake teaching at undergraduate level with administrative duties commensurate with the role, under the guidance and with the support of the course leader.</p> <p>The teaching is for the course ‘Technology and Human Values’, which addresses the ethics, politics, philosophy, and sociology of technology. This course is part of a wider ‘Data, Ethics, & Culture’ programme, and is also an option open to undergraduate students across Economics, English, History, Law, Politics, and Philosophy. The content of the course is being developed and the teaching co-delivered with colleagues at Northeastern University who are pioneers in this area.</p> <p>The ideal candidate will have a background in philosophy of technology, HCI, and/or STS, and the willingness and ability to collaborate with academics across disciplines and to make complex ideas relevant, engaging, and accessible to students.</p> <p>The job might suit an excellent final-year doctoral student or a more experienced academic interested in extending their range as part of a small, committed, and interdisciplinary, team.</p>	
Main duties and responsibilities

role, may vary over time depending on the expertise and inclination of the Teaching Assistant or changing needs in the Faculty or College.

The Teaching Assistant will be expected to attend and participate in all scheduled teaching sessions, so as to provide continuity for the students across this interdisciplinary course. The weekly teaching contact time will typically be no more than 3 hours a week within the specified term (typically with an additional 3 hours of non-teaching contact time). The exact arrangements are flexible depending on the candidate's preferences or constraints.

Teaching

Design, plan and implement effective and inclusive teaching arrangements and learning activities based on an existing syllabus

Teach across a range of topics (exact topics to be decided in light of your interests and expertise, in consultation with the course leader), using appropriate teaching, learning support and assessment methods

Assess the work and progress of students and provide them with constructive feedback

Seek ways of improving performance by reflecting on teaching design and delivery and obtaining and analysing feedback

Develop ideas for improving the learning environment, teaching and/or assessment and feedback methods, working in collaboration with academic colleagues who are also contributing to the course

Engage in professional development in relation to teaching, learning and assessment, including the use of an evidence-informed approach, which utilises the outcomes of research and scholarship to enhance practice

Management and administration

Administer the delivery of the course(s), under the guidance and with the support of the course leader, liaising with other academic colleagues as appropriate

Assist with the preparation of course guides, reading lists and virtual learning environment (VLE) content

Monitor student progress, achievements and attendance; participate in the development, administration and marking of assessments

Participate in faculty meetings and staff training opportunities
