### The Roles

New College of the Humanities wishes to make at least two appointments in Computer/Data Science.

- 1) **Full-time Lecturer/Senior Lecturer:** the successful candidate will be available to attend training opportunities at The Khoury College of Computer Sciences at Northeastern University Campus in Boston in Spring, ahead of teaching commencing September 2020.

We are seeking a highly motivated individual committed to excellence in teaching and scholarship. This is a permanent appointment with a teaching focus, and potential for management responsibilities related to growing computer science offerings at NCH. A 'Teaching and Research' contract will be considered depending on the merits of the successful candidate.

The successful candidate will collaborate with colleagues across Faculties in developing new academic initiatives within the institution. They will contribute to existing courses as well as creating new course content and materials. Student advising and service to the College are an integral component of the position.

- 2) **Part-time lecturer:** opportunities on a fixed-term contract, commencing

August/September 2020.

We are seeking candidates who can teach in core areas of Computer / Data Science (especially introductory programming and discrete mathematics), and with interests and expertise in applying computational methods to challenges and data in the social sciences and humanities.

## **Qualifications**

Candidates must hold a PhD in Computer Science or related degree from an accredited institution. Teaching experience at the undergraduate and graduate levels is strongly preferred. Experience with U.S. student demographic is preferable. Successful candidates will have demonstrated an expert grasp of knowledge of the field at all levels and be creative in their approach to teaching in an environment of cooperative, interdisciplinary and experiential education. Strong written, oral and interpersonal skills are required in order to communicate effectively with students in person and online.
