The role

The New College of Humanities at Northeastern wishes to appoint an Associate Professor (Teaching & Scholarship) in Project Management in collaboration with the College of Professional Studies (Northeastern University). The role will support the Master of Science in Project Management degree program. The position will be based at NCH at Northeastern, in London, and will be responsible for supporting the College in establishing and delivering this programme as part of the larger Northeastern University network in collaboration with the College of Professional Studies. The Master of Science in Project Management program is one of the largest Project Management programs in North America and is GAC® (Global Accreditation Center) accredited by the Project

Management Institute, Inc. In addition to London, classes are offered in an online, blended, and/or hybrid format at the University's Main Campus in Boston and Regional Campuses in Charlotte, NC; Seattle, WA; Silicon Valley, CA; Toronto, CAN; and Portland, ME.

We wish to appoint a specialist in any area of Project Management. The appointee will be flexible, able, and willing to be wide-ranging in their teaching and in their professional development. Preference may be given to candidates with active interests in the relationship of Project Management to one or more of the following areas: software and/or technology; employment contexts; diversity and inclusion. Preference may also be given to candidates with global expertise, and/or expertise in finance, and/or expertise in government relations.

Core duties will include delivering core courses in Project Management at NCH at Northeastern such as Foundations of Project Management, Risk Management, Scope Management, Quality Management, and Project Scheduling and Budgeting as well as concentrations in Agile Project Management, Construction Management, Leading and Managing Technical Projects, and Business Analysis. Reporting to line management in NCH at Northeastern, the appointee will oversee the instruction of specific courses on the curriculum. They will work with the CPS Faculty Lead for Project Management in the Northeastern University network in developing and implementing the curriculum and teaching materials for assigned courses within the framework of the Masters in Project Management. The appointee will be willing and able to identify and provide recommendations to keep the curriculum relevant and industry leading. In collaboration with the CPS Faculty Lead, the appointee will create modularity guidelines and recommendations for programme content integration across the programme and regional campuses of Northeastern University. The appointee will work with the CPS Faculty Lead and NCH at Northeastern to ensure the UK-based programmes meet license/accreditation requirements and participate in comprehensive regional evaluations and periodic reviews within the Northeastern network. The appointee will establish and develop co-curricular and extra-curricular student activities as appropriate and required.

The appointee will be expected to collaborate with the CPS Faculty Lead to create and manage industry advisory boards, and to develop professional networks within the UK and Europe so as to enhance the College of Professional Studies and NCH at Northeastern brand. In collaboration with the CPS Lead, and the NCH at

Northeastern team, the appointee will identify and reach out to possible Co-op and experiential learning sponsors to establish relationships and define engagement. The appointee will work within NCH at Northeastern to establish Project Management as a field in the institution in collaboration with the College of Professional Studies. The appointee will represent the programme in College of Professional Studies events and activities, and participate actively in the academic and administrative life of the College of Professional Studies and the wider Northeastern University network.

The nature of this transnational educational role is such that applicants must be willing and able to travel if required to other Northeastern University campuses, and potentially to other locations.

This position requires a flexible work schedule that includes being present on the NCH at Northeastern campus in London at required times.

We particularly encourage applications from those with an interest in innovative teaching, learning and assessment; those with experience of supporting a wide variety of students; and those belonging to groups underrepresented in UK higher education. We are open to appointing on a reduced fraction/job-share basis subject to our business needs.

A fractional appointment may be possible subject to our meeting our business needs for this appointment.

It will be a condition of any offer of employment that the appointee be nominated and accepted for an affiliate faculty appointment at the College of Professional Studies.
