The role

The New College of Humanities at Northeastern wishes to appoint Lecturers in Microeconomics. The appointee(s) will teach courses in Microeconomics to undergraduate students at various levels of study, including the setting of assessments, marking, and relevant quality assurance tasks.

We wish to appoint specialists in Microeconomics. Preference may be given to candidates with active interests in the relationship of Economics to one or more of the following areas: software and/or technology; employment contexts; diversity and inclusion. Specialisms in Industrial Organisation and/or Economics of Education are of particular interest for some positions.

Core duties will include: Teaching the assigned course(s) in Economics, which may include the creation or improvement of course materials, and working on a team to make the course interesting and engaging. The appointed person will also be expected to mark assessments, hold regular office hours (online), and contribute to following the College's procedures around assessments and

marking. Depending on the contract, there may also be an expectation of service to the Faculty or the wider College.

We particularly encourage applications from those with an interest in innovative teaching, learning and assessment; those with experience of supporting a wide variety of students; and those belonging to groups underrepresented in UK higher education. We are open to appointing on a reduced fraction/job-share basis subject to our business needs.
